## Bailey Trail Trek: Explore Off-the-Beaten Part of Eastern Arunachal Pradesh

- Trek in a remotest part of North Eastern state of Arunachal Pradesh
- Cross high mountain passes and glaciers during the trek

- Visit the renowned Tawang monastery

#### Overview:

The Bailey trail trek is an offbeat and exciting trek in the state of Arunachal Pradesh passing through virgin rhododendron forests against the beautiful backdrop of the Eastern Himalayan peaks of Gorichen and Kangto. This trek traces the historic route taken by the British Officer Lt. Col. F.M. Bailey who during his stay in this region, trekked from Tawang to Bomdila via Jang, Mago, Lurtem, Potok, Changla, Thungri, and Chander along with his team, crossing several high mountain passes, glaciers, alpine lakes and high altitude Monpa villages of present-day West Kameng and Tawang district. During this historic trek, you'd get a chance to cover a wide range of terrain, from lowland pastures and beautiful hamlets to mighty glaciers and splendid mountain views; interact with the local communities – yak herders and friendly Monpa tribals, and come across numerous waterfalls, icy rivers and mountain passes, touching almost 16000 ft above sea level. All this and more!

#### Itinerary:

##### Day 1: Guwahati

After arrival and check into the hotel, complete registration for the trek. Overnight stay in Guwahati.

##### Day 2: Guwahati – Bomdila (2415m)

7 hours drive while enjoying the beautiful views on the way. Overnight stay in Bomdila

##### Day 3: Bomdila – Chander (2530m)

After breakfast drive to the small Monpa village which is also the base village for the trek. Admire the stunning view of 6858m high Gorichen Peak. Overnight stay.

##### Day 4: Chander – Thungri

Start the trek in the morning which takes around 4 hours, covers 14 km distance and includes a steep uphill climb. Enjoy the view of Gorichen Peak.

##### Day 5: Thungri – Chang La (3751m)

Today, you'll be going for another 6 hours hard trek with steep climb to reach Chang La. You know you've reached Chang La when you see bunkers which were used by the army during the 1962 war. Overnight stay.

##### Day 6: Changla – Potak (4180m)

Early morning start to cross Chang La Pas and Poshjng La Pass as you cross the picturesque rhododendron forests. Overnight stay in tents.

##### Day 7: Potak – Lortum (4142m)

Today includes 8 hours trek and you'll be crossing Tse La Pass at an altitude of 4711m while passing

through wonderful views of lakes and peaks of Kangto and Gorichen. Overnight stay in tents.

**Day 8: Lortum – Mago (3531m)**

Today, you'll cover 7 hours trek through the river and forests while also crossing the Yak Grazing huts to reach Mago village. Overnight stay in tents.

**Day 9: Mago – New Mealing - Tawang (2736m)**

Start your 5-hour long trek to New Mealing from where you'll be driven to Tawang which is 5 hours drive away. Overnight stay in Tawang.

**Day 10: Tawang Darshan (3048m)**

Enjoy a full day excursion around Tawang, visiting the famous Tawang Monastery that was founded by Mera lama Lodre Gyaltso in the 17th century and accommodates over 500 monks today and is also home to several Buddhist texts and scriptures. You'll also head to Urgelling Monastery, War memorial and local bazaar today. Overnight stay in Tawang.

**Day 11: Tawang – Bomdila**

After breakfast, drive to Bomdila around 180 km distance away from here. Overnight stay in Bomdila.

**Day 12: Bomdila – Guwahati**

Drive down to Guwahati and to your onward journey.

- Local Transportation (AC may be switched offed at certain places enroute).
- Porterage of camping equipments and meals during trek.
- Instructors/Local mountain guide during trek.
- All meals as per mentioned in the program.
- 02 Snacks per day, Boiled Water during trek.
- Toilet Tents, Dome / Alpine Tents, Kitchen Tents etc.
- Trek Manager.
- Permit & entry fees.
- Sleeping bags.
